### **Short synopsis:**

"Good Guys & Bad Guys" is a post-Cold War romp through suburban Los Angeles. In 1996, expatriate filmmaker Rick Minnich returned to his native California for his ten-year high school class reunion to confront the right-wing suburban "patriots" who had made his life miserable during the Reagan era. The result is an entertaining and provocative look at what has become of the "Good Guys & Bad Guys" of yesteryear.

### **Long synopsis:**

Rick Minnich was a California boy. Born in 1968, he came of age during the Reagan era, and went through high school when the cold war between the "good guys" – the good old US of A – and the "bad guys" – the "Evil Empire" – was in full swing. "Pom poms and atom bombs – that's what I remember about high school," he says. "The elusive cheerleaders and the insane military buildup going on in the nearby Mojave Desert. It was the Reagan era – time to blast the Soviets off the planet." The larger conflict found its way into the classroom, and when Minnich went so far as to even raise questions about the whole Us vs. Them scenario, he found some of his classmates acting like he was one of "them." After college, Minnich went off to Eastern Europe for a first-hand look. He wound up studying film there, and working for Deutsche Welle TV in Berlin. In 1996, he returned for his ten-year high school class reunion, camera in hand, to, as he says, "rehash old strifes with former adversaries and reestablish contact with lost friends. A journey back to suburbia – to neatly manicured lawns, model citizens, gospel music and Harleys. A look at those who are fulfilling their pre-prescribed roles, and those who are still searching for an alternative." The result is this unusual personal documentary.
